Identification requirements

Acceptable forms of identification for candidates – Original documents only

General identification document rules

- Documents must contain a photograph that is a true likeness of the candidate.
- The document presented on the day of the test to confirm your identity must be the same document you used to register and book the test.
- The details used to book your test must be as stated on the document provided. If you have changed your name you must also provide evidence in Section 2.

<p>Passport</p> <p>Documents must be original and still valid.</p> <p>Photocopies or expired (out of date) documents will not be accepted.</p>			
			

Acceptable documents	Examples of acceptable documents
<p>Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) or Biometric Residence Card (BRC)</p> <p>BRPs and BRCs are standalone and not affixed to any other documents.</p> <p>This must be in date.</p>	 <p>The examples show two types of documents: a Residence Permit (BRP) and a Biometric Residence Card (BRC). <p>European Union (EU) Identity Card</p> <p>This must be in date.</p>	 <p>The examples show two EU Identity Cards. The first is a Polish card for Edward Antonina, issued in 2017. The second is a Romanian card for Gheorghe Dan, issued in 2016. Both cards include the holder's name, date of birth, sex, and a unique identification number.</p>
<p>Travel Document</p> <p>This must be in date.</p> <p>Emergency Travel documents will not be accepted.</p>	 <p>The examples show three Travel Documents issued by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. They are available in black, blue, and red covers. Each document is for a person named 'JANE' and includes the date of issue and expiry.</p>
